#### Sue Kenoyer NYSO President 2019 – 2021

"Opportunities for **D**ialogue, **K**nowledge, and **G**rowth"

I am writing this in late August and many of us are about to start a new school year over the next couple of weeks. I just watched the news and several well-known universities have already sent students home for the semester. Our main concern is our health and how much can we do and still stay safe. With this in mind, we have decided to cancel the face-to-face Fall Executive Committee Meeting/Seminar. I have had two worries keeping me up at night these past weeks. First, I have had grave concerns about the safety of our members if they attended the meeting. Let's be honest here, even if the decision to attend is up to the person there are members that would have felt it was their job to attend the meeting. I would have been devastated if anyone became ill as a result of attending the meeting. My second concern is the financial repercussions of cancelling the meeting. Karen Crumley has once again worked her magic and the hotel is willing to reschedule our event for a future date. Once that happened, I was so relieved to be able to change our Fall meeting to a virtual one - sad but relieved.

There are some pieces of business that our State BYLAWS and Standing Rules will not allow us to do at a virtual meeting and have to be done via electronic mail. One of these is to hold a vote by the Executive Board for the three paid positions of Executive Secretary, FDF Sales Administrator, and Webmaster. You should have received a ballot in early September. Please be sure to follow the directions in that email so that your vote counts. We will have some virtual meetings announcing the Pi State Achievement Awardee, running the Benefit Drawing for the Area Council baskets, have the State Membership Committee make its presentation celebrating membership in DKG, and possibly zoom sessions of some of our workshops. At this moment planning has just started and you will receive emails keeping you abreast of what will take place and when as we know it.

At this time, planning is well under way for Convention in Lake Placid from April 30 to May 2, 2021. If anyone had told me 14 months ago, when I took office, that I would cancel two state meetings, have two Area Council meetings switch to being virtual, have many visitations cancel, and have chapters switching to virtual meetings I would have been at a loss for words. That is something that has never happened! International also has three events planned for next July. Meetings are scheduled for Tampere, Finland; San Antonio, Texas; and Portland, Oregon. Join me in hoping that situations are such that these meetings can all take place face-to-face.

Southeastern held a very successful Area Council Conference this summer and Eastern is about to do the same on October 3. The great thing about this is that we can attend with no travel costs from anywhere in the state. Attendees at the Southeastern meeting were from all over the state. Many that would have found it difficult to attend an in-person meeting were able to be there. Eastern Area's meeting in still being planned as I write this note but, I suspect the same will be true there. International's Virtual Convention this summer can still be attended for the next year! In fact, I have heard of several that have continued to hold Zoom meetings all summer just to keep in touch!

#### Southeastern Area Conference

On June 6, 2020, Gamma Alpha Chapter presented the first virtual New York State Area Conference. With chapter webmaster **Kirsten Grunberg**, *Gamma Alpha* sisters organized the Conference presentation with its theme, "MoMA: Women Looking at Women."

We opened the Conference meeting acknowledging those individuals who succumbed to COVID-19 in the United States and around the world, and the pain felt throughout the Black community with the death of George Floyd. **Sue Kenoyer**, New York State President, welcomed members who represented chapters throughout New York State, Texas, Costa Rica and including a Gamma Alpha honorary member from South Sudan. Sue brought us up to date for the fall NYSO Executive Board Meeting/Seminar in Utica, the spring Convention in Lake Placid and the Leadership Seminar with webinars for the summer. **Connie Rensink**, DKG International Member at Large, gave the Conference Inspiration with her reading of the lovely poem, "Let Life Be Your Art" by Alix Koloff.

We celebrated **Patricia Kelly's** 50<sup>th</sup> year with DKG. Colleen Kelly, her sister, paid tribute to Patricia and her life's work dedicated to education. Among her achievements as Principal of JHS45 in the Bronx, Patricia introduced a variety of innovations such as: the academy of writing, introduction of students to the culinary arts, and establishing the first NYC bi-lingual gifted program.

Patricia Kelly gave the Conference Welcome and introduced Kirsten Grunberg, MEd. MSLIS and her presentation, "MoMA: Women Looking at Women." Kirsten identified the women artists that conference attendees submitted to her from MoMA's online collection. She reflected on their lives and achievements. Kirsten explored the relationships between the elements of art, art materials and themes in women's artwork. She showed the works of artists starting with Faith Ringgold, Carrie Mae Weems, Mary Cassatt, Dorothea Lange, Marisol Escobar, Helen Frankenthaler and many more. Kirsten's in-depth study for each artist was significant.

**Deborah Bedard**, New York State Past President 2015-2017 and NYSO Membership and Expansion Committee Chair spoke about the new DKG membership category, Collegiate Membership. She discussed the qualifications and the benefits of Collegiate Membership for an undergraduate or graduate student whose studies are concentrated in the field of education. An active member after two years is eligible to apply for a scholarship toward her studies. **Colleen Kelly**, *Gamma Alpha* poet, concluded the Conference with a recitation of her engaging poem apropos to our ability to come together despite our challenging times.

We were pleased with the positive results of our evaluation survey that **Mary Metzger**, Gamma Alpha sister, conducted online. ## <u>Time to Renew Website Compliance Assurance with International – due by October 31</u>

At the start of each new International Biennium (currently 2020-2022), all State Organization and Chapter websites need to apply for renewal of their Compliance Assurance from International. **Form 72**, which must be completed by Chapter Webmasters by **October 31**, may be found on the State website under CHAPTERS menu, Webmasters. You will note that this Form has two pages – information, signatures and a checklist. All areas must be completed and may be submitted electronically as an attachment. There is no fee. If your Chapter is currently developing your website, this form does not apply. It is for Chapters who already have their Chapter Website Compliance Seal. New websites must complete Form 72, check appropriate box and may apply at any time for their review and Compliance Seal.

The *Communications and Marketing Committee* met several times this year with recent meetings being held via Zoom- a first for many of us! Our goal this year is to encourage chapter communication throughout the state. We developed a survey which was sent to all NYSO Presidents to determine their needs in regards to accessing the materials on the NYSO site, the NYSO Facebook site and also developing their own websites or using other electronic forms of communication such as Go to Meeting, Envites, Facebook, Twitter and email communication. A total of 26 Chapter presidents participated in the survey and sent information to the Committee. After analyzing the survey, information was sent to chapter presidents to answer their questions and also provide additional support for communication and membership needs.

In addition, the Committee provided videos for the Leadership Training to assist new chapter leaders with questions about membership, leadership roles and communication needs.

#### **NYSO Committee Reports**

The **Finance Committee** consists of ten elected members (one from each regional area), the current President, and two ex-officio members, the Treasurer and Executive Secretary. Only the elected members have a vote. There is one inperson meeting in March and at least one virtual meeting in late summer/early fall. Each member serves a term of four years. Each biennium half of the elected members' terms expire. This year the following areas need representatives: Eastern, North Central, Capital, South Central and Northern. A person may serve two consecutive terms if she so chooses. If any members wish to continue, or if a new representative is needed, an application form needs to be filled out and sent to Mary Kay Hickey by November 15<sup>th</sup>. The application form is available on the NYSO DKG website.

For the past few years, it has been possible to propose a balanced budget for approval by making cuts or changing the way business is conducted. This past March it was decided that if additional cuts were made, it would negatively impact the operation of the society. Over the past several years membership has dropped dramatically. Over five hundred members have not continued their membership. This is a serious loss of income. Therefore, it was decided it would be necessary to have a modest increase in dues. Presently reserve dues are \$8.50 and active dues are \$16.50. Beginning in the 2022-2023 fiscal year, it is proposed that reserve dues will increase \$1.50 to become \$10.00 and active dues will increase \$3.50 to become \$20.00. This increase will allow the society to conduct its business at an appropriate level yet, should not be taxing on the membership.

The Board of Directors of the Pi State Educational Foundation, with heavy hearts, reports the death of **Pauline Levin** at 93 years of age in August. Pauline served along with **Agnes Becker, Jerry Fletcher and Anne Price**, as one of the founders and original directors of the Pi State Educational Foundation. Pauline had been living in Maine with her family for many years, but served in the New York State DKG prior to that in a number of capacities. Agnes shared the following memories about Pauline: "Pauline was a very special person . . .dignified, kind, most capable and reliable. Pauline joined Anne Price, Jerry Fletcher and me as a committee to develop the necessary documents to establish a Foundation. Because of her background as State Treasurer, Pauline had the foresight to offer suggestions others did not recognize. She was wonderful to work with because she offered valuable opinions in a respectful, never confrontational manner. When the PSEF was established in 2004, Pauline became the first Treasurer. She did the leg work necessary to open a bank account, she developed a bookkeeping system and designed the response cards still used today. Pauline served as Treasurer until 2006. During her tenure reports were always on time, complete and accurate. She was always available to answer questions. Pauline was the first of four Treasurers and surely made it easier for those who followed." Pauline's impact is still being felt today, as our current Foundation treasurer, Jean Sekel recalls how Pauline trained her in "all things financial" years ago while working with her on the State Finance Committee! She will be missed.

As our schools and communities are beginning to "open up" again from the pandemic, we encourage you to be thinking about new projects for grants. As we have been less able to interact personally with books and children and adults, perhaps there are other ways that we can be involved with literacy and people. It's been interesting to see how the educational system has been adapting! Deadlines for grant applications are December 1st and May 1st each year. 


