Leadership Development Committee



 - 3. A Chapter may receive this award twice for the same project.

 - 5. The Award provides funding for your project so that it may continue.

The **Frederica Hollister Professional Educators Award** is given to an active (not reserve) member of the NYS Organization who has held membership for a minimum of five years. She can be an active or former member of the teaching profession who has exemplified the best in education. Her contributions to education and other related fields in New York, and possibly the national level, should be varied, widely known, and well-documented over a period of five years. It should demonstrate the nominee's commitment to education locally, statewide and/or nationally.

The Frederica Hollister Professional Educators Award was established in 1988 from a bequest of Past NYSO President Frederica Hollister. She was a member of the Beta Rho Chapter. Along with honoring the recipient of this award, it also honors the memory of Frederica Hollister's exceptional contributions to education and women educators.

An application is part of the selection process for this award. All sections of the completed application must be submitted online with a submission date no later than February 15 to be considered. The nominator must include her letters of support and all requested documentation.

Native American Grant(s)-in-Aid

Native American Grant(s)-in-Aid (NAG) is one of many ways that DKG New York State supports women. This was established in 1967 by Past New York State President **Frederica Hollister**, and was originally called the Indian Affairs Committee. The purpose was to help Native American Women in New York State who hoped to enter education related professions. NAG continues to support young Native American Women who are progressing through higher education. Current awards give as much as \$1000 per academic year. Preparation for a teaching related degree is preferred but the scope of related service fields has been broadened over the years to encourage more applicants.

We encourage New York State members to recommend Native American women who may be eligible for this award, so we can make a personal connection. We want these future leaders to be connected to our chapters and we encourage the recipients to reapply each year.

The Verna Mulholland Friend of Education Award

Nominations Due by February 15, 2022

In 1983, the Verna Mulholland Friend of Education Award was established in honor of Verna Mulholland, elected *Pi* State President in 1981, and serving until her untimely death in 1982. The award was in response to her interest in recognizing non-educators' influence on education. A stipulation of the award is to honor a New York State woman, ineligible for membership in Delta Kappa Gamma Society International, who has been a positive influence on education. The recipient must be a woman outside the profession who has worked significantly toward improving the educational opportunities of others and who has given outstanding service to promote quality education. Chapters are encouraged to nominate deserving women for this Award and to send the nomination application to the Verna Mulholland Friend of Education Award Chair by **February 15**, **2022**. The Nomination Application Form is on the website. Rochester's School #3 Renamed in Honor of Alice Young

The Rochester City School District has renamed School #3 in honor of Dr. Alice Holloway Young nearly 70 years after she began her career as a teacher in the district. Alice became the district's first Black principal in 1962 when she was appointed to lead School 24. She later was named the district's first Title I director. While serving as a Rochester administrator, Alice was one of the planners and organizers of Monroe County's Urban-Suburban School Transfer Program, a program which today places and supports Rochester students in all Monroe County suburban districts. She retired from RCSD in 1985. Meanwhile, in 1961, Alice was a founding trustee of Monroe Community College. She served as an MCC trustee for 40 years, and as President of its Board of Trustees for two consecutive decades (1978-1998). She also served as the 1974-1976 president of Alpha Alpha Chapter. Dr. Young received the NYSO DKG Frederica Hollister Friend of Education Award in 2019.


