Congratulations to Karen Crumley who has been selected Chair of the International Nominating Committee! NYSO DKG is so proud!

KEYNOTE SPEAKER - Friday night, October 14th, 7 pm *"You Can't Help if You Don't Know: Current Trends in Substance Use with Teens"* **Patty Kilgore**, LMSW, The Prevention Council of Saratoga County

Substance Abuse has been around for a long time. What has changed are the types of drugs, the methods of consumption, and the ways to hide the drugs "*right under your nose*." In this presentation on Friday, October 14th, Patty will inform participants about the current trends in substance use for teens, focusing on alcohol, cannabis and nicotine. It will include what teens are using, how they are using it and the impact on their developing brains. Participants will also learn about changes in drug use and possession laws, what *delta 8 and 10* are, what *710 means*, what *a trap house is*, why *Imodium is trending* and how *kratom* is abused. The presentation includes multiple examples of drug related clothing, paraphernalia, stash containers and similar information.

Patty Kilgore, LMSW, has worked in the human services field for nearly 40 years. For 34 years she has worked specifically in the field of substance abuse/violence prevention and early intervention. For more than 25 years she provided Social Work services in several Saratoga County Schools. In addition to providing direct services with youth, she supervised and coordinated the Student Assistance Program for the Prevention Council of Saratoga County. During her tenure at the Prevention Council, she has had the privilege of supervising and mentoring multiple counselors, educators and colleagues. In addition to supervising the Student Assistance Program, she has added the education department at the Prevention Council to her supervisory duties.



Advocating for youth is her passion. She has been a volunteer member of the CAPTAIN Youth Shelter Home committee for 30 years. During that time, the homeless and runaway shelter evolved from a wish to a fully licensed accredited shelter, providing a safe home to thousands of youth over the last 25 years. Patty also has expertise in sexual abuse and suicide prevention for children. In her free time, Patty enjoys spending time with her three dachshunds, running, cycling and reading.

BYLAWS Committee: News From the International Convention

There were 118 amendments proposed for deliberation at the International Convention in July in New Orleans. Of the 118 amendments, 70 were discussed and voted on by the membership present. Of the 70 three were defeated. There were 48 that were never discussed so they were dropped to the floor. This means those amendments may be brought forth again, but the next Constitution Committee would have to do it as a completely new document and business of the next Convention.

Most of the amendments either were intended to "clean up" language or pertained to issues only at the International level. In terms of NYSO governing documents, there are automatic changes going to be made to the name of the Nominations Committee (becoming Nominating Committee), elimination of the Induction fee, and the definition of Reserve Membership. At the Chapter level, each Chapter should review its Standing Rules and:

- Change the name of the Nominations Committee to Nominating Committee,
- Remove any mention of an Induction fee, since there is no longer an Induction fee, and
- Make appropriate changes to reflect the new wording for Reserve Membership.

According to International Constitution change III.B.2, the new wording at the International level now says "Reserve Membership shall be granted only to a member who is unable to participate fully in the activities of the Chapter because of medical disability, geographical location, and/or no technological connection/skill."

International intends to inform the states about amendments that pertain to them and to individual Chapters sometime this fall. The NYSO BYLAWS & Rules Committee in conjunction with the NYSO Parliamentarian have inspected the 67 amendments and believe we have a very good idea about the changes we need to make. The Committee will be working on these changes. You will see our NYSO revision information in the winter issue of *Pi Lights*.

If your Chapter hasn't updated your Standing Rules this biennium, then PLEASE do so. Send a copy of your updated Standing Rules to Sue Kenoyer, Chair of BYLAWS & Rules Committee as well as to Jennifer Lee-Alden, NYSO President. You can find the checklist for Chapter Standing Rules on our State website.

educator who was voted *Teacher of the Year* in Iceland in 2018 and received the *Icelandic Educational Award* in 2020 for his outstanding contribution to education in Iceland. He is a Stanford Graduate who currently works at Iceland's Ministry of Education as a Senior Adviser on Educational issues and leads the implementation of Iceland's national Educational Policy.

A second Keynote Speaker was **Courtney Clark**, a Motivational Speaker and Author. She is the luckiest unlucky person in the world. After a series of major struggles beginning in her mid-20s, she has built two successful businesses and is the author of two books, including her most recent book, *The Successful Struggle: Powerful Techniques to Achieve Accelerated Resilience*. She works with people who want to adapt faster and achieve more and has spoken worldwide to organizations like Procter & Gamble, Dell, S&P, Humana, Cisco, and Cardinal Health.
