## Native American Grant(s)-in-Aid

The Native American Grant(s)-in-Aid (NAG) is one of many ways that DKG New York State Organization supports women.

This grant was established in 1967 by Past New York State President Frederica Hollister, originally called the Indian Affairs Committee. The purpose was to help Native American Women in New York State who hoped to enter education related professions. NAG continues to support young Native American Women who are progressing through higher education. Current awards give as much as \$1000 per academic year. Preparation for a teaching related degree is preferred but the scope of related service fields has been broadened over the years to encourage more applicants.

We encourage New York State members to recommend Native American women who may be eligible for this award so we can make a personal connection. We want these future leaders to be connected to our Chapters and we encourage the recipients to reapply each year.

## Latest News from the NYSO DKG BYLAWS & Rules Committee

I am pleased to return as your State BYLAWS & Rules Committee Chair. Since ALL Chapters are supposed to review their Standing Rules each biennium, it is time for that process to start again. There are some changes at the International level that Chapters need to know about. Our updated State BYLAWS & Standing Rules are now posted on the website.

All Chapter Presidents will be receiving a letter from me and my new Committee regarding the status of their Standing Rules. I will send this email out in September. Chapters that are several years out of date will be contacted by one of the Committee members to see how we can offer assistance in updating their Rules. You can expect to see this communication in October. To aid you in updating your Rules, go to the NYSO DKG website and look at the checklist of required items for Standing Rules. International has changed the dues schedule for new members. It now reads: "New members shall become members when dues are paid. New members who join between July 1 and December 31 shall pay the full international, state and chapter dues for the current fiscal year. New members who join between January 1 and March 31 shall pay half international and half state dues. New members joining between April 1 and June 30 shall pay full international, state and chapter dues for the ensuing year. Reinstated members shall pay full international and state annual dues whenever reinstated."

The purpose of the Committee, through the support of the Executive Committee, is to plan and implement leadership programs for State and Chapter Officers and State Committee Chairs.

Committee members held their first meeting in July to plan the August 4 Committee Chair Training via Zoom. In addition, the members adopted their goals for 2023-2025 and will add to them as needed:

- Develop and present an in-person Leadership Development Workshop for the NYSO Executive Committee.
- Develop and present a Leadership Development Seminar for State Committee Chairs and new Chapter Presidents, using virtual presentations and Flip Grid.
- Plan and hold workshops for new Chapter Presidents at the Fall Executive Board Meeting/Seminar, Spring Executive Board Meeting/Seminar and NYSO DKG State Convention, based on the needs and requests of the State Chairs, State Executive Committee and Chapter Presidents.
- Include leadership development for all NY State members through online opportunities.
- Promote the active participation of all Committee members.

A Flipbook was also prepared with important material for Committee Chairs along with digital Flip videos and supplemental information. Following the August 4 meeting, an evaluation was sent to the Committee Chairs. LDC will hold a follow-up meeting to address questions and concerns.

LDC also participated in the August 11 Executive Committee training and discussed ideas for 2024 Presidents' Training, and Leadership workshops at the April Executive Board meeting. The next meeting is planned for September 14.


