A Parliamentary Minute

Chapter Nominations Chair:

- Do schedule a meeting with your chapter's nominations committee members soon to begin the process of having a slate of officers prepared for a spring meeting.
- Do think about asking a 4-5 year member to step up into one of the roles such as Secretary either recording or corresponding. Their journey of leadership begins in the chapter.
- Do have a Recording Secretary. You do not need a Corresponding Secretary.
- Do have a First Vice-President. You do not have to have a Second Vice President.
- Do reach out to all chapter members if you are having a difficult time finding officers. Sometimes a person needs to be personally asked and will not self-nominate, but they will accept a position if there is a personal touch... *especially via phone*.
- IMPORTANT: It is not the job of the Nominations Committee to find a treasurer. The treasurer is appointed by the Chapter Executive Board.

Every chapter is supposed to update their Standing Rules each biennium. Your State BYLAWS and Rules Committee has been busy contacting chapters that didn't update their Rules during the last biennium.

The International Meeting this July in New Orleans is a Constitutional Convention. This Committee will be very interested in outcomes from the votes on Constitutional issues. All states must align their BYLAWS and Standing Rules with the International documents. The results of the Constitutional Convention will probably force us to make corresponding changes in our State governing documents. These changes will then have to be made to any Chapter Standing Rules. One expected change will be to allow electronic voting.

Please take the time to look at your current Standing Rules to see if there are changes or additions that would make your chapter function better. We look forward to helping you in any way we can.

NYSO Membership and Expansion Committee

Spring brings new opportunities in our DKG lives. As COVID numbers decline, in person meetings will be blooming throughout our NYSO. As you meet this is an opportune time for DKG sisters to review the membership guidelines. The following guidelines are taken from the Go-To-Guide (2019) which is posted on the International website under Governing Documents.

Membership classifications in the Society are active, reserve, collegiate, or honorary.

Active – An active member is a woman who is or has been employed as a professional educator at the time of her election.

- 1. In the selection of a member, the definition of professional educator is interpreted to include one-to-one instruction as well as group instruction.
- 2. The chapter decides if the prospective member is classified as a professional educator.
- 3. A woman who is not presently employed as a professional educator but who left the profession before retirement is eligible for invitation to active membership
- 4. The word employed is defined as currently hired by an employer and/or paid a salary or fee for specific educational service
- 5. Certification or licensure is not required.
- 6. A professional educator may be invited to membership regardless of where she 18 Go-To Guide for Chapter Members MEMBERSHIP lives or is employed unless a restriction is included in state organization bylaws.
- 7. An active member participates, as she is able, in chapter programs and projects, contributes to committee work, votes, shares in financing chapter activities and may hold office.
- 8. A member retired from educational work retains the rights and privileges of active membership.
- 9. An active member is not eligible to become an honorary member.

Reserve – Reserve membership shall be granted only to a member who is unable to participate fully in the activities of the chapter because of physical disability and/or geographic location.

- 1. Reserve members have all the privileges of membership except that of holding office and have no obligations except payment of dues and the scholarship fee.
- 2. Retirement is not a reason for granting reserve membership.
- 3. Being too busy to attend meetings is not a reason for granting reserve membership.
- 4. Reserve status is granted by a majority vote of the chapter.
- 5. A reserve member, so requesting, shall be restored to active membership.

Collegiate – Collegiate membership shall be granted to undergraduate or graduate students who meet the following criteria:

Undergraduate student collegiate members:

Be enrolled in an institution offering an education degree and have the intent to continue academically and professionally in the field of education; and

Be enrolled within the last two years of their undergraduate education degree.

Committee News

Membership and Expansion Committee continued...

Graduate student collegiate members:

Have graduate standing in an institution offering an education degree; and Have the intent to continue academically and professionally in the field of education.

- 1. Collegiate members have all the privileges of membership except that of holding office and have no obligations except payment of dues.
- 2. A collegiate member may serve as parliamentarian.
- 3. When a collegiate members starts her career as a paid educator, she will pay active ember dues and become an active member.
- 4. If a collegiate member does not pursue a career as an educator, her membership will expire upon graduation or withdrawal from the education degree program.

Honorary – An honorary member shall be a woman not eligible for active membership who has rendered notable service to education or to women, and is elected to honorary membership in recognition of such service. Honorary membership can be granted at the chapter, state organization, or international level.

- 1. Honorary members may participate in all activities except that of holding office
- 2. Chapter honorary members are elected in accordance with chapter rules. The Recommendation for Membership (Form 11) is used.
- 3. Each chapter honorary member is presented with an honorary membership certificate. She may be given a key pin.
- 4. A former educator is eligible for active, not honorary, membership.
- 5. An honorary member may not be inducted in absentia.
- 6. An honorary member may serve as parliamentarian.

When looking for prospective members be ready to think outside the box. In the Dec. /Jan. 2021 edition of International's *President's Page* a brief article presented ideas for attracting new members.
