



Convention Keynote Speaker Bruce Coville Friday Evening, April 28, 2023

"Ripples" will be the title of the presentation by children's literature author, Bruce Coville of Syracuse, the Keynote Speaker on Friday, April 28 at the 2023 NYSO DKG Convention "Capitalizing on the Benefits of DKG".

His speech will focus on "how we as people who work with children affect the future in ways that it is impossible to predict, but that can be extraordinarily profound."

Coville was born in Syracuse, New York, in 1950. He grew up (*supposedly*) about twenty miles north of the city, around the corner from his grandparents' dairy farm, where he spent a great deal of time dodging cows and chores. As a young reader he loved Mary Poppins and Dr. Dolittle, and still has fond memories of rising ahead of the rest of his family so he could huddle in a chair and read. He consumed lots of things that people consider junk (Nancy Drew, the Hardy Boys, Tom Swift, and zillions of comic books) but seems to have survived undamaged. His only real regret is the time he spent watching television, when he could have been reading instead. (A mind is a terrible thing to waste!)

His first book, **THE FOOLISH GIANT**, was published in 1978. It was illustrated by his wife, Katherine, whom he had married in 1969. This was followed in 1979 by **SARAH'S UNICORN**, also illustrated by Katherine. After a long period of working separately, the Covilles began collaborating again with **SPACE BRAT** and **GOBLINS IN THE CASTLE**, both published in 1992.

Before getting published, Bruce worked as a gravedigger, a toymaker, a cookware salesman, and as an elementary school teacher (second and fourth grades). He left teaching in 1981 to devote himself to becoming a full-time writer – though it took another five years to achieve that goal!

He has now published over a hundred books, which have sold more than eighteen million copies and won Children's Choice Awards in over a dozen states. Among his most popular titles are **MY TEACHER IS AN ALIEN, INTO THE LAND OF THE UNICORNS**, and **JEREMY THATCHER**, **DRAGON HATCHER**.

In 2001 he founded Full Cast Audio, an audiobook company dedicated to creating unabridged, full cast recordings of the best in children's and young adult literature. He has produced more than 100 audiobooks, working with authors such as Tamora Pierce, James Howe, and Shannon Hale.

He now resides in Syracuse, where he lives with his wife, his daughter, and his granddaughter. And he continues to write.

NYSO Nominations Committee Nominations 2023-2025

The NYSO Nominations Committee held its virtual Zoom meeting on Friday, November 18, 2022. The committee's major order of business was to approve a slate of officers for NYSO DKG for the 2023-2025 biennium, to be voted on by members at the Executive Board Meeting on April 29, 2023. The committee reviewed all submitted materials and deliberated about each candidate before agreeing unanimously on the following Officers:



President: Jennifer Lee-Alden

Jennifer Lee Alden was initiated into *Beta Omega*, Capital Area, in May 2009, sponsored by Past NYSO DKG President, Joan Slagle. She earned her B.S. in Music Education from SUNY at Fredonia, M.S. in Educational Psychology, and Certificate of Advanced Study in Educational Administration from the College of St. Rose, Albany. She taught Music in the Shenendehowa Central School District for 26 years where she also served as Summer School Assistant Principal since 2016. Presently, Jennifer is the Class Assistant Principal at Shenendehowa High School since 2020. Jennifer has been involved at the local, regional, and International levels. At her

Chapter level, Jennifer served two biennia as President (2014-2018) and served as Corresponding Secretary (2012-2014). She was the Capital Area Council Chair from 2014 -16. She has served effectively and capably on the Pi State Executive Committee as State Secretary, Second Vice President, First Vice President, and President since 2021. Jennifer has presented workshops at the 2012 Fall Conference and the 2013 Spring Convention; was a member Educational Excellence Committee 2011-2013 and Chair 2013-2015; has performed music for Pi State Executive Board Meetings/ Seminars and Conventions; has attended Leadership Training working with Committees, presenters, State Officers, Chapter Presidents, the Webmaster and Pi Lights Editor. At the Regional level, Jennifer attended the 2011 NE Regional Conference in Hershey and the 2013 NE Regional Conference in Portland, Maine. At the International level, she attended and assisted at the 2012 International Convention in NYC and presented a workshop at the 2014 International DKG Convention in Indianapolis. Jennifer was the recipient of the International Lucile Cornetet Award which she used to attend and present at the National Association for Music Education Conference at the Gaylord Opryland Hotel, Nashville, TN on October 27, 2014. She continues to add to her presentation experiences and regularly contributes to her local, state, and the national teaching profession. She has been a contributing composer and author for Activate! Magazine, a teaching magazine for K-6 music educators since 2011, has co-authored a teaching resource book, Mission Composition, Lorenz Publishing Corp. (2015). She has been a member of the district-level Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) team since 2021, in the Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development, and the district-level Board of Education Policy Review Committee since 2020. Her various community involvement activities include civic and service clubs, assisting with the local Boy Scouts, and serving on two Ad Hoc Committees for the Galway Board of Education. Jennifer's special interests are gardening, reading, cooking, cross-stitching, and she loves spending time with her husband Greg, and her three wonderful sons.

First Vice President: Anna Marie Bonafide

Anna Marie Bonafide was initiated into *Alpha Nu*, Capital Area, in May 2003, sponsored by the late Marie Muller, a long-time member of the chapter and Anna Marie's former math teacher. She earned her B.A. in English from the University at Albany in 1980 and her M.S.Ed. in Secondary Education from the College of Saint Rose in 1995. Prior to beginning her teaching career in 1993, she was an editor and journalist for a community newspaper for 12 years. In 2006, Anna Marie received National Board Certification in ELA- Adolescence and Young Adult and her Ph.D. in Curriculum and Instruction from the University at Albany in 2011. For over 28 years until her retirement in 2021, Anna Marie was an ELA teacher at Rayena-Coeymans-Selkirk Senior High School, serving as the

Department's Curriculum Content Specialist for 14 years. Since 2008 she has been an adjunct lecturer in the Educational Theory and Practice Department at the University at Albany, NY, she is presently an adjunct with NYSUT Education and Learning Trust. In 2021, Anna Marie was appointed Executive Secretary for NYSO DKG. She was elected to the Nominations Committee, Capital Area Council in 2019, serving until her Executive Secretary appointment. At the state level, she was a member of the Communications and Publicity Committee and was Chair from 2019-2021. At the Capital Area Council level, she has served as a member at large from Alpha Nu and as Chair. Anna Marie was Alpha Nu Chapter President from 2012-2014, and prior to that time was First Vice President, Second Vice President, and Chair of the Publicity Committee. From 2014-2016 she was Alpha Nu Secretary and in 2015 named Woman of Distinction from the Alpha Nu Chapter. She has served as Project Chair and is presently Literacy Committee Chair. In 2012, Anna Marie represented Alpha Nu at the DKG International Conference in New York City and was also recognized at that time for obtaining her doctorate. In 2007, she was recognized as a Pi State and International Scholarship recipient. In 2006, she received the Lucile Cornetet Scholarship for her National Board work. In 2022, Anna Marie represented NYSO DKG at the International DKG Convention in New Orleans as NYSO Executive Secretary. Prior to her retirement, Anna Marie was also involved in several professional organizations including the New York State English Council, the National Council of Teachers of English, the International Literacy Association, and Kappa Delta Pi, presenting at several international and state conferences from 2007-2019. Her research, "The Construction of Reading Identity in Struggling Middle School Readers" was published in SAGE Research Methods Cases in 2014 and she was a member of the panel publishing "Position Statement and Research Brief: Engagement and Adolescent Literacy" in 2019 with the International Literacy Association. When her children were young, Anna Marie was involved in many community organizations including St. Patrick's Church, Ravena, RCS Community Library, Ravena-Coeymans Cub Scouts, and several extra-curricular programs at RCS. She also served as Village of Ravena Trustee from 2001-2006. In her leisure time, Anna Marie enjoys traveling, reading, attending theater productions, and spending time with her family, her husband, John, and her adult children, Jason and Lucy.


