The project was such a huge success that Diane and the Seneca Falls Historical Society wish to continue offering students in grades 3-5 opportunities to explore and engage in local history. The project was awarded \$1,000.

Funding Chapter Projects: The Bea Small Award

The *Bea Small Award* was established in 1999 in memory of **Bea Small**, a member of the *Omega* Chapter. The sole purpose of this Award is to recognize State Chapters having an existing program/project which addresses a need of a specific population within the Chapter's geographical area.

The Board of Trustees administering this Award consists of four Trustees: Chair Mary-Martha Harvey (24-Omega EC) Executive Committee Rep; Joanne Carroll (40-Alpha Pi E) Educational Excellence Committee Rep; Marie Scoles (52-Beta Delta EC) Communications & Marketing Committee Rep; Evelyne Bottorf (24-Omega EC) Omega Chapter Rep.

The submitted project must have been originated by the Chapter and be ongoing for a minimum of two years. The project must respond to the needs of a particular population within the Chapter's geographical area.

The postmarked deadline for submitting the application form to the Chair of the Board of Trustees is February 15th. The application form may be found on the NYSO Website under applications for New York State Awards. The application must be submitted by the Chapter President, a Chapter Officer or the Chapter Project Chair. The Chapter President must sign the application.

Electronic submission of the application is preferred. If a project is funded, an article with a photograph should be written for an issue of *Pi Lights*, the NYSO website, and the local media.

The Award consists of a certificate and a monetary amount to be determined by the Board of Trustees. The Award(s) shall be presented to the Chapter during a Spring Executive Board Meeting or NYSO Convention. There is a Post-Project Report Form that is to be submitted by March 15th of the following year. The Award will be publicized in the Fall, Winter or Spring issues of *Pi Lights* and on the NYSO Website.

In 1983, The Verna Mulholland Friend of Education Award was established in honor of **Verna Mulholland**, elected Pi State President in 1981, and serving until her untimely death in 1982. The award was in response to her interest in recognizing non-educators' influence on education.

A stipulation of the award is to honor a New York State woman, ineligible for membership in Delta Kappa Gamma Society International, who has been a positive influence on education. The recipient must be a woman outside the profession who has worked significantly toward improving the educational opportunities of others and who has given outstanding service to promote quality education.

Chapters are encouraged to nominate deserving women for this Award and to send the nomination application to the Verna Mulholland Friend of Education Award Chair by February 15, 2022. The nomination application form is on the website.

DKG Recruitment & Membership Plan In Action

The Membership and Expansion Committee assists chapters to revitalize membership for new members to join, current members to remain active, and past members to be reinstated. DKG International established a *Recruitment and Membership Plan that* has many suggestions which Zeta chapter implemented to increase membership. The foundational ideology that Zeta emphasized for recruitment promoted DKG as a professional educational organization that focuses on building relationships and supporting each other in a congenial atmosphere.

When I began my tenure as Zeta's president, it was before COVID. My mentor and colleague, Annmarie Santorelly (immediate past president) and I decided on having a DKG social event with veteran members bringing potential members. When a candidate was hesitant to come alone, the invitation was open for them to bring a friend; another educator that they admired. We asked our members to look for strong student teachers that were paving the way for the next generation of educators. Our members and guests enjoyed a casual wine and cheese buffet. Instead of a lecture-like presentation by Zeta's Executive Board, members mingled with aspirant members in small table groups which created an intimate dialogue. Each member discussed the benefits of DKG, including scholarships, and chatted about the tiers of membership. A folder was distributed for prospective members to review at their leisure.

Throughout the year, the conversations continued and we invited those educators who were interested to meetings and events. By the end of the inaugural year of implementation, we had seven members join our chapter, including two collegiate members that are still with us today.

As we approached the next year, our members were cultivating relationships with eight possible inductees and then COVID hit. Our Induction was canceled and our plans were upended. Throughout the next year, conversations and emails with support and concern were given to all chapter members, especially those members that were thinking about joining. Although it took 15 months, we were able to induct six of the original eight candidates.

When reaching out to educators for membership, broaden your outlook. Remember that all professions within the educational spectrum are welcome into DKG: Core and encore teachers, coaches, administrators, BOCES faculties, directors, adjuncts, and professors. Ask an administrator if there is someone within the school that is energized and ardent about teaching. Look at your child's or grandchild's teachers and see if there is someone that impresses you.

A prospective member is someone as passionate as you!

The founding members of Delta Kappa Gamma dreamed of an organization to assist women in the field of education. Offering DKG membership to collegiate women intent on pursuing a degree in education provides our NYSO Chapters and members a unique opportunity to impact the future of education.

Currently the *Zeta chapter* of DKG has two members, **Raquel Reyes** and **Jessica Steward**, who have taken part in collegiate membership.

Raquel Reyes is a graduate student currently studying at SUNY New Paltz in pursuit of a Masters degree in STEM Education, while teaching Kindergarten in Newburgh, NY. She learned of DKG from her professor, **Dr. Doreen Baldino Croyle** (current *Zeta* chapter president). Doreen shared the benefits of membership with Raquel and introduced her to members of the chapter. Raquel said she "felt honored to be asked to join as a college student." Raquel shared that being a DKG member while being an education student has been impactful as she has been able to hear about many different teaching experiences and meet other exceptional women educators.

Jessica Steward was introduced to DKG by a member of the Zeta chapter, Dawn Dancy. After attending a few meetings and getting to know other women in the chapter, Jessica knew that she wanted to be part of the organization. DKG had a significant impact on Jessica while she was in college and preparing to become an educator. She shared, "I was able to hear the 'do's and don'ts' of teaching before stepping into the field... By hearing the opinions and successes/failures of experienced teachers, I could note (for myself) the ways to be the best teacher I can be. These conversations also built my confidence before I went into a classroom for student teaching." Jessica attributes some of her success in landing a teaching job to her DKG membership, as it showed school leaders her passion for teaching and being a professional member in her field. After college, Jessica joined DKG as a full member. She explained, "It's a group of women who are out to seek the best way to make an impact on students' lives, no matter what school you may be working in. I decided to stay in DKG and become a regular member for these reasons - the conversations, the ideas, and the difference we can make!"

Being collegiate members of DKG had a profound impact on these two women. The opportunity to reach young women and welcome them into the organization is certainly advantageous. Collegiate membership shall be granted to undergraduate or graduate students who meet the following criteria:

- 1. Undergraduate student collegiate members
 - a. Be enrolled in an institution offering an education degree and have the intent to continue academically and professionally in the field of education; and
 - b. Be enrolled within the last two years of their undergraduate education degree.
- 2. Graduate student collegiate members
 - a. Have graduate standing in an institution offering an education degree; and
 - b. Have the intent to continue academically and professionally in the field of education.

Collegiate members have all the privileges of membership except that of holding office, but they may serve as a parliamentarian and have no obligations except payment of dues. Collegiate status is granted by a majority vote of the chapter.

When a collegiate member starts her career as a paid educator, she will pay active member dues and become an active member. If a collegiate member does not pursue a career as an educator, her membership will expire upon graduation or withdrawal from the educational degree program.
