### **Successful Virtual Workshops Offered**

The NYSO Educational Excellence Committee along with President Jennifer Lee-Alden, first Vice President Anna Marie Bonafide and the Executive Committee have opened up a focus this biennium to offer more virtual workshops in between our in-person State meetings, in particular those workshops that could offer CTLE credits for those who need them. For all the busy professionals currently in the classroom who need to get their professional development credits, we hope offering virtual workshops with credit will make it more convenient to gain those.

With that goal in mind, we put out the word in the September *Pi Lights* and we got an immediate response! *Thanks* to **Amber** (**Gladle**) **Aldridge**, *Gamma Epsilon* Chapter President, in November, we were able to offer two virtual workshops. Although they were not eligible for credit, as we continue to refine the requirements, they were well attended. The one on *Canva*, the free digital tool for creating flyers, invitations, etc., had 29 registrants and the one on *Google 101*, had 20 registrants. Amber plans to offer *Canva*, *Part 2* at the Spring Meeting to give a more hands-on experience to both those who took Part 1 and for those who are new to the program as well.

In addition, First Vice President **Anna Marie Bonafide** will be offering a virtual **Book Club**, using the 2023 DKG Award book- <u>Voices of Newcomers: Experiences of Multilingual Learners</u> by Denise Ammeraal Furlong. The Book Club will be meeting for one hour on three Tuesdays: January 16, 23 and 30, 2024. *If you are interested in attending, please register here:*

# It's Time to Look at Chapter Standing Rules!

Every Biennium, Chapters are asked to review and if necessary, update their Standing Rules.

Rules are then sent to **Sue Kenoyer**, the State BYLAWS & Rules Committee Chair, **Karen Crumley**, Parliamentarian and **Jennifer Lee-Alden**, State President. They will compare your Chapter Rules to the *Checklist for Standing Rules* and let you know what you might consider adding the next time your Chapter Rules are reviewed. A copy of your latest rules is then added to the State files and all other earlier versions are destroyed.

The BYLAWS & Rules Committee members are assigned to Chapters and act as your Liaison to the Committee. They will contact you to ask if you need any assistance during the biennium until we have received your Rules.

If, after review, you decide that no changes are necessary, then update the review date on your present copy of the Standing Rules and send them to the three people listed above.

Due to the decrease in the number of grants and one-year extensions being offered in the past five years from DKG International, our Committee is urging you to hold World Fellowship Fundraisers in your Chapters to assist by sending donations this coming year! Funded only by donations!

**FYI:** New York State recipients (*above*) were 5 of the 10 in U.S. 5 in Canada.

The 2023-2024 list totals 15 awards at \$4,000 and 9 extensions at \$1,000.

Though DKG evens out what was a usual annual budget of \$78K from donations, the last two years has seen a decline in giving with \$71K 2022 and this year \$68K.

In addition to the following proposed changes in the BYLAWS, the Pi State Educational Foundation Parliamentarian and Board of Directors reserves the right to make numbering and wording changes and to update the BYLAWS of the Pi State Educational Foundation as is deemed necessary for clarity and ease-of-use.

#### 1.To Amend ARTICLE 2 NONPROFIT PURPOSES Section 2, 2 SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES AND PURPOSES

To provide assistance and/or funding to members and/or chapters of the New York State organization of Delta Kappa Gamma Society (Pi State). The funding shall support qualified projects, programs that relate to the development of learning and literacy of any New York State person who needs special assistance.

The funding shall support qualified projects, **programs and/or scholarships** that relate to the development of learning and literacy of any New York State person who needs special assistance.

Rationale: Reflects current practice

#### 2.To Amend ARTICLE 3 DIRECTORS SECTION 1 NUMBER

The Corporation shall have at least five (5) Directors and collectively they shall be known as the Board of Directors.


