2011 Pi State Executive Board Meeting & Seminar Cancelled: E-ballots Used for the First Time

**Reservations** were made. **Workshops** planned. **Agendas** sent. **Preparations** were complete but no one counted on the serious flooding in the Binghamton area. This caused extensive damage to the Binghamton Regency Hotel and Conference Center and the cancellation of the *Pi State Fall Seminar/Executive Board Meeting* scheduled for *September 23-24, 2011*. Thanks to the efforts of the Executive Committee, all members who had registered for this event were contacted. For the first time, the Pi State Executive Board was asked to vote on-line.

**Reports** were sent. **Votes** were taken on recommendations. Once again, Pi State proved that by being flexible much could be accomplished. *Many thanks to everyone!* The following actions were approved:

- At the recommendation of the Awards Committee, the application deadline for Pi State awards, scholarships and grants-in-aid was changed to March 1<sup>st</sup>.
- At the recommendation of the Finance Committee, the Iona M. Keeler Award Fund's base amount of \$50,000 may offer scholarships for no more than 5% of base amount. It will be administered by Scholarship Committee.
- At the recommendation of the Executive Committee, the Executive Board nominated Jane Tanner for the International offices of Northeast Regional Director and Trustee of the International DKG Educational Foundation. We are happy to announce that Jane did receive the nomination for Trustee of the International Educational Foundation.

### **Membership: Resources for Our Chapters**

In the Membership column of the Summer Issue of *Pi Lights*, I mentioned a new feature on the DKG website that is available for your use in **orientation for prospective members.** The program is called *"Pride in the Big Picture."* 

#### "Pride in the Big Picture"

Using this program was a focus of the Membership Chair Training conducted by International at the Northeast Regional Conference that I attended in Hershey. The "Pride in the Big Picture" Program contains a letter of invitation to a prospective member to come to an informational meeting. You can personalize this letter and print it out. The informational meeting is based on a power point and the accompanying guide to "Pride in the Big Picture." It is a very professionally created orientation. It articulates exactly what the invitees should know about Delta Kappa Gamma and the honor of invitation. Equally important as knowing what the Society can offer the invite is that the presentation delves into what the invitees can offer the Society. Generally in the past, our orientations focused on what DKG was all about and the honor of membership, but this program allows the invitee to see herself contributing to a greater purpose immediately...if she feels the fit is right. It is aimed at giving the invitee all the information to help make an informed decision about joining, and thus the hope is that she will be more likely to stay as an active member of the Society. In the past, an inductee might find that the Society was not what she expected after joining and then she resigned. This orientation truly does give the big picture and is very welcoming. I would add that the training in the use of this orientation was done by our International President, Dr. Jensi Souders herself. I'll tell you that if I were a prospective member and had the welcome and information presented to me as she did it, I would sign up in a minute! But you at the chapter level can be just as persuasive because the guide that goes with the power point helps you make all the points that Dr. Souders did.

#### "Sustaining the Big Picture"

In addition to the orientation guide, there is a re-orientation guide and powerpoint, "Sustaining Pride in the Big **Picture**," available to all of you on the DKG website. It can be used in short segments to help chapters re-energize. You can decide what parts to use with your chapter, and as with "Pride in the Big Picture", you will get accompanying notes and a guide to help you.

#### **Locating Resources**

You will find the power point on the website <u>www.dkg.org</u> by typing in "*Pride in the Big Picture*" in the search box. Then click on <u>Orientation-Re-orientation-Delta Kappa Gamma Society</u>. That will take you to the power point, the invitation letter and the re-orientation power point as well as the guides.

I am sure you will like what you see and hope you will take advantage of these tools to help you grow and nurture your chapters.

#### ~Important~

The State Committee Guidelines have been updated for the upcoming Biennium 2011-2013. There are several very important changes that should be noted by the Chapters. Changes in the Chapters' *Standing Rules* should reflect these changes.

Amend **Section 8 Historical Records and Scrapbooks** by amending 8.31, 8.32, 8.33, 8.34 To Read:

**8.31** Historical records shall be kept electronically to assure the continuation of the history of the Society in Pi State.

8.32 Chapters should be encouraged to up-date their histories electronically for the Pi State file.

**8.33** Chapters should be encouraged to use digital photography and photo storage files to keep a record of chapter activities.

**8.34** Chapters should be encouraged to submit chapter photos for electronic presentation at conferences/convention.

Amend **Section 8 Historical Records and Scrapbooks** by adding 8.35 To Read:

**8.35** Use of social networking will be encouraged by members. Chapter and Convention information will be posted on venues such as Facebook.

Rationale: We need to be able to use modern technology to streamline our communications and to preserve and store our records.
