I had the great privilege and joy to attend the 2013 *Northeast Regional Conference* with 60 Pi State members and guests. The beautiful seaside city of Portland, Maine provided a conference setting that was rich with cultural opportunities and steeped in a friendly and relaxed pace. The panoramic ocean view provided a beautiful vista for our daily activities and, of course, the food was beyond measure!

From the moment I arrived at the Registration Table, I knew that this would be a wonderful experience. The warm hospitality and helpfulness made me feel that I was among friends from the onset. Wednesday evening, I was able to attend the First General Session. I was moved by the flag processional and welcoming ceremonies. Report from Travel & Study Stipend Recipient: European Regional

New Yorkers often refer to Amsterdam, the Netherlands as Holland or to American author, *NY Times* journalist and historian, Sir Russell Shorto's book, "*The Island at the Center of the World*," as the Dutch origins in NYC or according to my 17 year-old granddaughter as the most liberal city in the world. Now DKG sisters can refer to Amsterdam as charming as a high-heeled Dutch wooden clog with our red rose symbol painted on its vamp.

Ria Bleeker, Rier Smits and their Committees made the sub-theme of this Regional, "*Friendship in Education, Worldwide*," evident in their staging of events and activities. Amsterdam's Regional Community College, where Ria teaches, served as the venue for most speeches, workshops and market place. The presentation of the flags of the nine countries that make up the *European Region* was truly impressive. Greetings were given by the Regional organizers and International President, **Dr. Beverly Helms**. Representing the Mayor of Amsterdam, Alderperson **Carolien Gehrels**' opening remarks made everyone feel welcome and valued as an educator.

In her opening remarks, **Maria Heimback**, *European Regional Director*, explained the themes and goals for the Conference. She shared of her torment as a German in the city of Anne Frank. She spoke of her friendship, developed while she was a student at Plattsburgh, with the daughter of German Jews. Her friend's family had fled Germany and finally settled in the Adirondacks. Her Mother was denied her PhD because she was a Jew. Maria related that when she finally learned about this injustice, she contacted her University and one of the too many wrongs was set right. Her friend's Mother who was by then 93 years old was awarded her degree.

Dutch Night was "verrassing"—a surprise. Dutch treats such as "bitterbal," a deep fried meat ragout ball covered in bread crumbs, were served with other specialties. The camaraderie and conversations were wonderful. Dutch brewed beer and wine, although the latter was not made from tulips, was served. A band livened up the festivities.

At the First General Session, our International Headquarters Administrative Staff presented "*Ignite*." I hope that this spiffy presentation about our Society will be packaged and available to local Chapters. It would make a great Founders' Day program.

The theme of citizenship was woven into presentations on women's right to vote in Norway, the art of movement, songs from Iceland and an update on the crippling teachers' strike in Denmark over "pre-time." Following workshops and afternoon tours participants met at Town Hall for a reception hosted by Alderperson **Carolien Gehrels**. We then boarded boats for the canal trip to the Stork restaurant for our *Night on the Town*.

The Second General session focused on language. **Maria Heinback** wrote in the program for the Conference that "out of necessity, Europe has agreed on a lingua franca: English is taught as the first foreign language at schools at all levels throughout Europe." **Dr. Adriana Fishta-Bejko** from Calgary, Canada lamented that although hundreds upon thousands of dollars have been spent on bilingual education, the results have amounted to only "kitchen-English vocabularies." She stressed the need for incorporating brain-based research with Structured English Immersion (SEI). **Taina Hokkanen** spoke about teaching Finnish to Immigrant Women.

It was also a time for "see you" in Indianapolis in July 2014 at DKG International Convention and in Sweden in 2015 at the European Regional. *Hope you can make both events!*

Mersereau Grant-in-Aid Award*, *The Frederica Hollister Pi State Professional Educator's Award* (I am also on that Committee.), *The Bea Small Award*, and the *Bea Small Leadership Speakers Fund*. Each award is unique in its purpose. If you check the Pi State Website, you will find all of them listed as well as information about the award, about the woman for whom the award is named, the requirements for application, the applications themselves, and contact information for the Chair of the Committees administering them. *All of these awards have a March 1 deadline for applications*.

Since there is no *Fall Executive Board Meeting/Seminar* this year, why not put a discussion about the awards on your Chapter agenda for your next meeting? Deadlines always seem to creep up on us so the sooner you learn about the awards, begin Chapter discussions and decisions on a nominee and begin the application process, the better.

All Pi State Officers act as a Liaison to at least one of the 10 Area Councils. I am the Liaison to the Capital Area Council. The Liaison helps to keep the Chapters in each Council informed about Pi State and International news and to bring the Chapter concerns and achievements to the Executive Committee.

SUGGESTED ACTIVITIES FOR CHAPTERS:

- Provide information through speakers, panel discussion, handouts, etc.
- Visit organizations or facilities that relate to the identified need or issue.
- Contact local and state representatives/legislators.

- Build coalitions with other organizations or civic/community groups which are concerned with the same issues.
- Invite Chapters to study, plan and execute actions.
- Network, volunteer expertise, advocate for education.
- Attend the National Legislative Seminar: March 16-19, 2014 in Washington, D.C.
- Provide regular communication with Area Councils

SUGGESTIONS ON HOW YOU CAN GET INVOLVED AND INFORMED ABOUT LEGISLATION THAT AFFECTS NEW YORKERS: Know your representative, answer surveys. Sign up for online alerts, use the power of the web and pen. THE PI STATE EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION

In June the *Pi State Educational Foundation* awarded the following two project grants of \$600.00 each:

- ✓ A grant was awarded to **Nancy Catalano**, *Tau*, for their project "*Born to Read*". This Foundation award is the second grant given to *Tau* for this project. Since then *Tau* Chapter has continued to provide reading packets for new mothers and children's books for toddlers all of whom receive services through their county's *WIC Program*. - ✓ The second grant was awarded to **Susan Coolican**, *Alpha Rho*, for their project "*Picnic in the Park*." The grant will allow the Chapter to provide more books to young children in summer park programs that provide lunch. Previously, they had provided slightly used books to children. Now they plan to purchase new books for preschoolers. Chapter members help distribute the books at lunch time.

Frederica Hollister Professional Educators Award

Verna Mulholland Friend of Education Award

Native American Grant-in-Aid

Since 1968, when this special project was established, Pi State has offered *Grant(s)-in-Aid* to qualified Native American young women, who plan to continue their education after completing high school.

Did you know?

- 1. The grants are awarded to Native American women attending a two or four-year college and planning to work in the field of education or other related service field. Grants are for \$500 per semester and are renewable for a maximum of \$5000 over a period of five years. To be eligible, an applicant must have at least one Native American parent, be listed on a tribal role and complete an application form which is available on Pi State website
- 2. There are currently two 2012 grant recipients attending colleges: Jennifer Martin at St. John Fisher and Aubrey Phillips at SUNY Canton.
- 3. There are eleven reservations located in Pi State two on Long Island (Suffolk County), one in northern NY (Franklin County), two in central NY (Onondaga and Madison Counties) and the remaining six have tribal lands in Cattaraugus, Allegany, Genesee and Niagara Counties in Western NY.

The Native American Grant(s)-in-Aid Committee encourages all Pi State DKG Chapters to select a member responsible for the Native American Program in their Chapter to promote the Native American Grant(s)-in-Aid program. Potential contacts include the Native American community, Guidance Counselors and young women who are hoping to continue their education.
