One of the joys of living in New York State is the **changing** of our seasons. Each season involves special celebrations with family and friends. Our homes are often decorated to reflect the **change** and even our wardrobes **change** as the result of the **challenges** of our weather! As a State, we gather for our Fall Executive Board Meeting/Seminar at the Woodcliff Hotel in Rochester on October 14-15 entitled "*Celebrating the Invitation of Membership by Exploring the Challenges of Change.*" I invite all Pi State Members to join us as we explore **changes** that affect our professional careers, **changes** to help strengthen our Chapters and **challenges** that affect our personal lives.

During our Leadership Development Seminar hosted in August for Chapter Presidents **Nita Scott**, Membership Services Administrator from Delta Kappa Gamma International, presented important data that all Pi State Members need to be aware of. Membership in our Organization has been steadily declining throughout the last few years. In 2009 our Society's total membership was 106,837. Currently we have 75,190 members. The good news shared by International is that the rate of members dropped has slowed from 7.24% to 3.08%. New York State Organization in 2009 had a total membership of 3,249 and currently has 2,424.

As a State, we must unite together to face the **challenge** of declining enrollment which threatens many of our Chapters. In April during our Spring Executive Board Meeting/Seminar our State Membership and Expansion Chair, **Melanie McDonald**, presented a workshop on the **new membership plan from International**. This **change** supports strengthening our Chapters by assisting Chapters to attract new members. The Membership and Expansion Committee will again present this new International membership initiative workshop on Friday evening, October 14. Read on in this issue to learn about other workshops that will be presented involving both **changes** and **challenges** in our lives. In addition on Saturday morning, October 15 as Chapter Presidents and other Pi State Executive Board members gather to conduct Pi State Business, a special seminar, "*Membership Makeover*" will be held to assist Chapter Membership Chairs and other interested Chapter members implementing the plan within their Chapters. It is my hope that Chapters, who are facing declining membership, will send a representative to attend this seminar and begin the work of rebuilding and strengthening New York State Chapters.

Our Fall Executive Board Meeting/Seminar will also feature an **Information Fair** on Friday evening during our dessert reception. As our Chapter Presidents begin their biennium of leadership, the information and resources gathered during the Fair will help them meet the **challenges** of Chapter leadership. This Fair is also an important opportunity for Pi State Members to become better acquainted with the many benefits of membership.

Over the past few years as professional educators in New York State we have faced the **challenges** of **changes** on multiple fronts: Common Core Standards, testing and the implementation of new evaluation procedures (APPR) to name a few! On Friday evening **Regent Beverly Ouderkirk** will discuss the state of these **changes**. I am looking forward to hearing how these changes will affect my students.

On Saturday our meeting will conclude with a **Legislative Luncheon** organized by our State US Forum Representative, Barbara Bostwick-Quinn, and our Pi State EEC Committee. **Dare Thompson** from the League of Women Voters will help us become informed and use our voice to meet the **challenges** of **change** on the political

Regent Beverly L. Ouderkirk "Changes in Education"

Beverly L. Ouderkirk was appointed to the New York State Board of Regents on March 10, 2015 for a five-year term effective April 1, 2015. She proudly represents the students, educators, parents, and communities within the eleven counties comprising the major geographic portion of the North Country. Regent Ouderkirk brings to her appointment over fifty years of experience in public education in New York State.

Regent Ouderkirk began her professional career as a kindergarten teacher. She continued teaching for seventeen years in various elementary and special education classrooms in the Jordan-Elbridge and Weedsport Central School Districts as well as for the Onondaga-Cayuga BOCES. She served as Elementary Principal, Director of Elementary Education, COH Chair (Committee on the Handicapped) and Deputy Superintendent in the Gouverneur CSD. Regent Ouderkirk was Superintendent of Schools at Morristown CSD, Tioga CSD, and Valley CSD before becoming a BOCES District Superintendent at Genesee Valley in Western New York. Following her first retirement, Regent Ouderkirk served four additional districts as an Interim Superintendent over a ten-year period. The culminating activity of her long career was as a Shared Superintendent for the St. Regis Falls and Brushton-Moira Central School Districts, a first in New York State.

Regent Ouderkirk's continuing goal is to make a difference in public education for children.

2016 Legislative Luncheon Saturday, October 15th 12:30 - 2:30pm



Dare Thompson, President of the New York State League of Women Voters, will be our guest speaker. Dare is a resident of Marlboro and has been active in Central New York and the Hudson Valley. Dare will share with us how to be an active Citizen advocate on upcoming legislative issues and changes.

Dare states, "I was pretty apolitical for the first 25 years of my life, but then I accidently got a job teaching middle school Social Studies. When I was teaching the Constitution, it really hit me that all of us-including me! -run the country, and I wasn't showing up for work. I also realized that everything depends upon individuals taking

action by voting, running for office, demanding good government through lobbying or even taking a case to court ... There is no THEY, only US, and we get the government we work for."

A graduate of Swarthmore College, PA with a Masters from Oberlin, OH, Dare taught in the Shipley School in Bryn Mawr, PA and Cleveland City Schools, OH. Her NY career began in 1982 where she was the Executive Director of the Kirkland Art Center in Clinton. She relocated to Columbus, Ohio in 1995 to be the Executive Director of Ohio Citizens for the Arts. Returning to NY in 1999-2007, she served as the Executive Director of the Hudson Valley Writers' Center in Sleepy Hollow. Dare is currently a Consultant and actively involved with the Quakers. Dare shares her connection to women's suffrage as a Quaker who graduated from Swarthmore College where Lucretia Mott was a founder and Alice Paul was a graduate. She serves as the Assistant Clerk of the Poughkeepsie Friends Meeting and an active leader in the New York Yearly Meeting.

In the League of Women Voters, Dare is a Past President of the Utica/Rome League of Women Voters and Mid-Hudson Region, a strategic member of the US League's Long Range Planning Committee, Past President of the Rhode Island LWV and has served on league boards as a local president in three different states OH, RI and NY.





In 1967 Past Pi State President **Frederica Hollister** selected as her special project a plan to help Native American girls in New York State who were hoping to enter the teaching profession. It started as a temporary project which had to be approved by the Executive Board each year, but in 1975 the Board voted to make the Indian Affairs Committee a continuing committee and in 1989 the Committee was renamed *Native American Grant(s)-in-Aid Committee*. Changing conditions over the years have necessitated some changes in the original plan. The most notable change is the amount of the award increasing from \$250 to \$500 per semester and including enrollment in either a service related field or education as one of the criteria for selection.

Pi State members are encouraged to recommend Native American girls who might wish to pursue a career in education or service related field to the *Native American Grant(s)-in-Aid Committee*. Chapters are also encouraged to contact recipients who are in the Chapter area, invite them to a meeting, send them a card or help support them financially. *Let them know you care*.

Two \$1000 Grant(s)-in-Aid were awarded in 2015-16 to **Lori Lachowski** and **Alanna Pyke**. Lori is a member of Tuscarora Indian Nation and Alanna is a member of the Mohawk Nation, St. Regis tribe. Lori plans to become a history teacher. Alanna is studying biomedical engineering with minor in Native American Studies at Yale University and plans to teach at the university level and conduct research to find new and innovative ways to help people with injuries or disease. The Hedges has housing for up to 85 people in cottages and main buildings. Some families have a tradition of coming every summer.
