President's Message





"Celebrating the Invitation of Membership" Deborah Bedard Pi State President 2015 - 2017

See you at the April 29-30, 2016 Pi State Executive Board Meeting/Seminar at the Sheraton Syracuse Hotel and the January 22, 2016 CTAUN Conference at the United Nations, NYC!

I received my "*Invitation of Membership*" to our Society in the spring of 1998 from a fellow educator in my building whose passion for teaching I admired. After attending an Orientation Tea to learn about Delta Kappa Gamma International, I accepted my "*Invitation of Membership*" and joined as a member of *Alpha Epsilon* Chapter.

This was certainly not an easy decision for an active teacher and mother of three, who was also commuting two hours a day! However, this simple act has changed the course of my life both professionally and personally. My involvement in DKG began as an opportunity to take 6 nights over the course of the year to enjoy fellowship, stimulating dinner conversation and a chance to grow professionally. Throughout my years in working with the Capital Area Council, I have become acquainted with many, wonderful friends and educators. Networking at the Area Council level has enhanced my classroom. Accepting the office of Chapter President I began learning about yet another level of our Society, Pi State.

Over the two biennia of my Chapter Presidency, I attended the President's Leadership Seminar, participated in Pi State Fall and Spring Business Meetings/Seminars and enjoyed two wonderful Conventions. After four years as Chapter President, I passed the torch to our next Chapter leader but continued to serve as my Chapter's Corresponding Secretary and Member-at-Large for Capital Area Council.

In the meantime the leadership skills I gained from DKG led me to accept the role as Union President of our local during a stressful three years in our district. You'll notice several positive changes when you do:

One of Pi State President **Deborah Bedard**'s initial priorities at the start of her Biennium was to revise and update the Pi State Website. President Bedard and Pi State Editor **Mary-Martha Harvey** created a template that utilized the boxes and html format that currently exists. Each box was assigned a title in bold and listed the contents. To reconstruct the Pi State Website, Pi State Webmaster **Barre Hall** redesigned all the boxes with these titles in bold and the contents listed. Editor Harvey collected former documents, updated, formatted or created them and sent to Webmaster Hall who posted them on the website. The result of almost three months' work is a website that we can all effectively use.

At the *Northeast Regional Conference* in Baltimore Editor Harvey attended trainings for Editors and Webmasters. It was announced that html format would no longer be supported, effective July 2016. International hosts our website. At the 9.14.15 Pi State Executive Committee Meeting, President Bedard appointed an *Ad Hoc Website Committee* to design a totally new Pi State Website. The Committee Members are President **Deborah Bedard**, *Alpha Epsilon*, Webmaster **Barre Hall**, *Gamma Epsilon*, Editor **Mary-Martha Harvey**, *Omega*, and **Heidi Himes**, *Gamma Delta*, a Technology Specialist and Chapter Webmaster. A report of the Committee's progress will be presented at the *Spring Executive Board Meeting/Seminar* in Syracuse on April 29-30.

Verna Mulholland Friend of Education Award

Verna Mulholland was president of *Alpha Phi* and *Pi State* President. She and **Gladys Mersereau** were planning the State Convention to be held in Lake Placid at a future date, when they were both killed in a car accident. Verna had always envisioned giving an award to someone who made an outstanding contribution to education but wasn't eligible for membership.

This Award is given annually to a woman who is not a member of *Delta Kappa Gamma Society International* nor eligible for membership in the Society but rather someone outside the profession, who has worked toward improving the educational opportunities of others. The Award consists of a plaque and a \$300 stipend to cover the cost of attending the *Spring Executive Board Meeting/Seminar* to receive the award.

Chapter members and Chapters are requested to submit nominations for this award. The application form is available on the Pi State website in the "*Application Forms*" box. Native American Grant(s)-in-Aid

In 1967 Past Pi State President **Frederica Hollister** selected as her special project a plan to help Native American girls in New York State who were hoping to enter the teaching profession. It started as a temporary project which had to be approved by the Executive Board each year, but in 1975 the Board voted to make the Indian Affairs Committee a continuing committee and in 1989 the Committee was renamed *Native American Grant(s)-in-Aid Committee*. Changing conditions over the years have necessitated some changes in the original plan. The most notable change is the amount of the award increasing from \$250 to \$500 per semester and including enrollment in either a service related field or education as one of the criteria for selection.

Pi State members are encouraged to recommend Native American girls who might wish to pursue a career in education or service related field to the *Native American Grant(s)-in-Aid Committee*. Chapters are also encouraged to contact recipients who are in the Chapter area, invite them to a meeting, send them a card or help support them financially. *Let them know you care*.

Two \$500 Grant(s)-in-Aid were awarded in 2014-15 to **Kaitlyn Lauzon** and **Alanna Pyke**. Both Native American women are members of the Mohawk Nation, St. Regis tribe and reside in Hogansburg, NY. Kaitlyn is attending SUNY Canton in the Nursing Program. Alanna plans to study biomedical engineering with minor in Native American Studies. It is an honor for Pi State to support these deserving young women.

"85 Years and Beyond: Advancing Key Women Educators" was the theme of the Northeast Regional Conference held in Baltimore, MD, July 7-11th, 2015. There were 18 states and areas represented including Washington, DC and Ontario. Attending this Conference reinforced for me that there are so many compassionate, smart and focused women educators. Through networking I learned strategies to help my Chapter grow as well as Continued on page twelve

ideas that I can use in my classroom in the fall. I was excited to witness the support for the Common Core Standards and to realize that we are not alone as we do creative and interesting activities in our classrooms. It was wonderful to learn and to share with so many passionate women, including sisters from Pi State.

Part of what I learned is we are as powerful as we choose to be.

This Conference focused on ways we can work together to create change by advancing education, children and DKG members. The keynote speakers were inspiring. One of the keynote speakers was **Sean McComb**, 2014 Teacher of the Year. He spoke on four shifts that he sees happening.

- 1. **Sparking hope**. He talked about Michelangelo who once said, "*I saw the angel in the block of stone and I carved until I set it free.*"
- 2. Teach students before content. He said, "My teacher gave me the best gift: believing in me."
- 3. Collaborative Culture is becoming stronger.
- 4. **Teach the whole child**. He talked about students having individual opportunities as well as a collective responsibility.

I believe these four shifts are what we all aspire to in our schools and in our worlds.

The Honorable **Susan Hazlett**, District Administrative Judge for the Ninth District Court in Harford County, Maryland, spoke about a justice system model they have for helping delinquent, troubled youth in the criminal system between the ages of 11-15. The program offers these troubled youth a chance to stay out of juvenile detention if they take responsibility and make amendments in ways determined by their peers and overseen by volunteer judges. I found it hopeful because it gives them an opportunity to take responsibility and walk a positive path.

From the many choices of interesting workshops, I chose seven. *"Just the Minutes"* centered on taking meeting minutes correctly. Since the meeting minutes are legal documents, it was surprising what is excluded and what remains included. For more information you can order a booklet called *"Spotlight on you the Secretary"* from the National Association of Parliamentarians at <u>www.NAP.org</u>.

Another workshop, "Out of the Box: A Writing Route to Helping Students Reach their Potential in STEM" addressed the importance of writing in STEM as tied to the Common Core Standards. One of the most important suggestions was to use Project Based Learning. Students become engaged, use communication skills to discuss, question and state opinions. Can you explain in writing how to use a new cell phone to a 90 year old? It was a great opening activity that can be used in the classroom.

All the first timers to the Regional Conference gathered together opening day to get the lay of the land. It was an easy way to meet other educators when we learned dance moves to the song "*Celebrate*," which we performed as a flash mob at the opening dinner. *What a fun way to get involved*!

We were staying on the beautiful Inner Harbor of Baltimore, which is in close proximity to other points of interest. I saw the early photos of Pluto being transmitted from New Horizons at the Science Museum's Planetarium. I also went to my first professional baseball game, the Baltimore Orioles vs. the Washington Nationals. It was great when the game ended with a home run hit from the Orioles, breaking a tie to win.

It was an honor to have been selected to receive the Pi State Travel & Study Stipend. I certainly encourage others to apply. I will be sharing more conference ideas and experiences with my Chapter and presenting information from this conference at my school as part of our Professional Development Day in the fall. *Thank you again for the opportunity to attend the Northeast Regional Conference. 2015 DKG Mentoring Conversations "Will you accept this rose?" If you have watched or heard about the reality TV shows, The Bachelor and The Bachelorette, you will recognize this invitation. At the predictably dramatic conclusion of each episode, contestants are selected to continue on in the process, provided they accept the proffered invitation. Accepting the rose indicates a willingness to stay on the show in hopes of finding true love. During training for State Membership Committee Chairs at this summer's Northeast Regional Conference, Nita Scot, International Membership Services Director, presented an overview of the 2015 DKG Mentoring *Conversations* opportunity. Chairs then received two cloth roses, one to wear during the Conference to prompt conversations about mentoring and one to give away to someone agreeing to accept the invitation to become a DKG mentor. DKG Mentoring Conversations pair a veteran educator/DKG member (mentor) with a less experienced educator/DKG member (mentee) for monthly communications specific to the needs of the mentee. This communication may occur by internet, phone, face-to-face or through DKG social communities, depending on the team's choice of medium. Both parties agree to adhere to a relationship founded on confidentiality, openness and sincerity. Mentoring pairs are encouraged to maintain their relationship for two years. The term "mentor" comes from Homer's epic poem, The Odyssey. Odysseus asks his friend, Mentor, to watch over his young son, Telemachus, while Odysseus is away fighting the Trojan War. Twenty years later, when Odysseus fails to return home, Telemachus begins an investigation into what happened to his father. Athena, Goddess of Wisdom, disguises herself as Mentor to provide Telemachus with guidance and advice. A 17th century French romance emphasized the character of Mentor and the word meaning "wise counselor" came into usage in both French and English. Mentors have been reaching out to the less experienced to share support and wisdom gained through experience ever since. Will you accept this rose? While you may not think of yourself as a "Goddess of Wisdom," if you are a veteran teacher, you have much to offer our less experienced members. And if you are a newer teacher, DKG wants you to know that you are not alone. There are caring, supportive experienced members who want to support you as you continue your professional growth as a key woman educator. DKG International will pair mentors and mentees who indicate interest. You may register to participate in a Mentoring Conversation Community when you create your member profile at www.dkg.org. Use your member ID number (printed on your membership card) as your user name and the default password: dkg2014society. Go the www.dkg.org website. Scroll down until you see the gray box. Click on the last link for "My DKG." Click on the drop-down link to "My Profile" to enter your profile information. If you wish, you may change your password after you have successfully logged in for the first time. To edit your information in each section, click on the pencil icon. For networking opportunities, join social and professional communities using the "Communities" button or link. Choose the groups you would like to join and submit a request. If you prefer a less formal approach, consider how your Chapter might implement its own mentoring program. As an application of the Support for Early Career Educators initiative, mentoring is a powerful tool for relationshipbuilding. Forming mentoring relationships could lead to increased Chapter membership. Mentoring could also be used as a leadership development tool within a Chapter to help newer members both contribute to their Chapters and take advantage of all that DKG has to offer. How will you respond to this invitation? Will you accept this rose? The EEC Committee will support programs of action that promote the personal well being, intellectual growth and global awareness of women educators; encourage a focus on arts at State Conventions and Seminars; and develop strategies that will enable Chapters to empower leadership in members. 


