President's Message





"Be the Spark – Igníte the Flame" Jeanne Schenk

Pi State President 2011 - 2013

As I write this article, I am enjoying an unusually warm and sunny day in February in the Finger Lakes. I believe, at least in part, that this mild winter is because I had four snow tires put on my car in November. Now, the Elementary Teacher part of me wonders if March will come in like a lion and go out like a lamb.

Weather was no concern on January 31, 2012 when the Pi State Executive Committee held another *Go-to-Meeting*. Reports were sent in advance to each member and ideas were shared by all. This type of meeting saves time for those attending and money for Pi State. We have already scheduled two more meetings with the Executive Committee for this spring. The Awards Committee will use GTM in late March. **Karen Crumley**, *Tau*, Chair of the 2012 International Convention, has also used this option with her Committee. *Yes*, *Pi State is connected!*

On February 3, 2012, the Seventh Annual **CTAUN** (*Committee on Teaching about the UN*) conference was held in New York City. Twenty-two Pi State sisters attended the conference with our own **Anne-Marie Carlson**, *Phi*, serving as Chair of the event. Following the theme "*Education IS a Human Right*," I was impressed with the caliber of the speakers and found the panel discussions especially informative. Since DKG is an International Society, I found it interesting that we in New York share some of the same educational concerns of countries around the world. Keeping and paying for excellent teachers, and renewing the passion and creativity of our educators to prepare our students for the future are several of our shared concerns. The International project "*Schools for Africa*" is a way we can help others meet this challenge.

On a more local level, **THAT**, *Teachers Helping Other Teachers*, is another International project that I hope members of our Pi State Chapters are continuing to act on. In the final months of a school year, there are many issues that early career educators face. Please continue to offer these teachers support. Hopefully, you are keeping track of the time and financial support you have offered these teachers. We will be collecting this information to share with the federal government this summer.

At this time, more than fifty Chapter Presidents have completed their International Annual reports. In reviewing the answers and concerns in these reports, some matters stand out. Many Presidents when asked to rate their Chapter felt that they were "maintaining, need energy." It seems we need to "Be the Spark!" Some Chapters mentioned having difficulty completing a slate of officers. Other problems include commitment to the Chapter. Younger Chapter members who are busy with families and their professional careers do not see their DKG membership as a priority. Chapter Presidents suggested that workshops for Chapter Committee Chairs would be helpful and felt that some of this leadership development could be handled at Area Conferences. This is an idea that the State Executive Committee has looked at for a couple of years. Now would be a good time for Area Councils to consider leadership development as part of their Area Conferences. I appreciate your efforts and ideas and want you to know that the Pi State Executive Committee and Committee Chairs are ready and willing to support your ideas.

Registration for our *Spring Seminar/Board Meeting* in Syracuse is now open. Early registration ends on March 31, 2012. The form is in the Winter *Pi Lights* that were mailed to all members.

In only five months, Pi State will host about two thousand DKG members in New York City. This leaves time for you to plan, save and attend this very special event. Please carefully consider attending this once in a lifetime event and volunteering to make it successful.

Finally, as we near the end of our each of our current Chapter Presidents' biennium, please agree *to be a spark for your Chapter*

so together we can ignite a very visible flame of Pi State Pride.

Amend Section 8 Historical Records and Scrapbooks by amending 8.31, 8.32, 8.33, 8.34

To Read:

- 8.31 Historical records shall be kept electronically to assure the continuation of the history of the Society in Pi State.
- 8.32 Chapters should be encouraged to update their histories electronically for the Pi State file.
- 8.33 Chapters should be encouraged to use digital photography and photo storage files to keep a record of Chapter activities.
- 8.34 Chapters should be encouraged to submit Chapter photos for electronic presentation at conferences/convention.

Amend Section 8 Historical Records and Scrapbooks by adding 8.35

To Read:

8.35 Use of social networking will be encouraged by members. Chapter and convention information will be posted on venues such as *Facebook*.

Rationale:

We need to be able to use modern technology to streamline our communications and to preserve and store our records.

Pi State Achievement Award

Is there a member of your Chapter who always says "yes"? Does she also say "yes" when asked to serve at the State level, whether as a State committee member, as a member of a State Convention Committee or State Task Force? The *Pi State Achievement Award* Committee is looking for these hard working and productive members.

Why not nominate her for the **2012** *Pi State Achievement Award*?

The *Pi State Achievement Award* is designed **to honor a member who has made outstanding contributions to the Society at the State level.** The nominee should have attended Pi State and International meetings, served on State committees and actively participated in Delta Kappa Gamma affairs in Pi State. This award is based on nominations submitted by the membership and will be judged by the Pi State Achievement Award Committee.

The nominee must be:

- 1. Nominated by a member
- 2. Approved by the nominee's Chapter President
- 3. Supported by **three** letters of recommendations from Chapter and/or State members who have worked with the nominee.

Since this award is a surprise, please do not ask the nominee for information. Instead consult Chapter files, other members and/or the State Executive Secretary. All information received by the Committee is considered confidential. The rules of eligibility are:

- 1. Only active members who have made outstanding contributions to education and have rendered exceptionally fine service to the Society at the state level shall be eligible for the Achievement Award.
- 2. Each nominee must have a minimum of **five** years of active membership in good standing.
- 3. No person may receive the *Pi State Achievement Award* a second time. A State President is ineligible for the Achievement Award during her time in office.

With the rules of eligibility in mind, look around you for a member who deserves this honor and submit an application for this outstanding woman. Many have done much for our Society and merit our recognition with this honor. Please send the completed nomination form **postmarked by March 1, 2012** (a requirement) to:



13th Annual CTAUN Conference February 3, 2012 – United Nations, NYC

"Education IS a Human Right"

Anne-Marie Carlson, *Phi*, Chair of the Committee on Teaching about the United Nations (CTAUN), welcomed a very diverse audience of 450: including UN staff, NGO representatives, 48 Fulbright scholars representing 33 countries around the world, teachers and students from Ontario, Quebec and the US, especially from the Tri-State area. Among the largest groups present were 56 members of DKG International (*including 22 from Pi State*) and 15 representatives of the American Association of Women.

Conference Statement

The United Nations first articulated the right to education in the 1948 **Universal Declaration of Human Rights**. Article 28 stipulates that everyone has the right to a free and compulsory elementary education with technical, professional and higher education "equally accessible to all on the basis of merit." The purpose of education is to promote the "full development of the human personality" and to strengthen "respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms."

Over the last 63 years, many international covenants, conventions, treaties, declarations, conferences, plans of action and reports have built upon this base to assure that governments commit to and meet their obligations to realizing the human right to education. *The Convention on the Rights of the Child* (1989), for example, makes explicit how the right applies to children and their parents. UNESCO's 1990 *World Declaration on Education for All* re-emphasizes that every person must be educated "to develop their full capacities, to live and work in dignity." Yet, worldwide today, it is estimated that 69 million children are not in school and approximately one adult in six is unable to read or write. Two out of three illiterate adults are women.

Our Conference this year investigated the many causes of this disparity between the stated goals and the actualities of the human right to education for so many children and adults around the world. We focused on how access to and quality of education, seen by some as two sides of the same coin, can steadily improve the educational experience for all learners.
