About the Pi State Scholarships

The *Pi State Scholarship Committee* is here for you. This Committee promotes interest in and support for scholarships both at the State and International levels in keeping with one of the seven purposes of the Delta Kappa Gamma Society: to endow scholarships to aid outstanding women educators to pursue graduate study. We have expanded that to include other educational goals.

Through the generosity of past Pi State members' bequests and the interest accrued from them, as well as Chapter and member contributions, there is money available each year so that Pi State is able to offer several scholarships. These scholarships are available for graduate study, research, enrichment study, continuing education, master's degree study, doctoral degree study, Road Scholar (*created by Elderhostel*) travel, and National Board Certification.
