Slide 25: Fox Run Vineyards on Rt. 14 in Penn Yan-west side of Seneca Lake. Tours are offered.

Slide 26: Fox Run has a Café and Market.

Slide 27: Smith Opera House is in downtown Geneva. It was constructed in 1894 and now offers live performances and films.

Slide 28: This is an aerial view of Hobart and William Smith Colleges in Geneva. Established in 1797. It's a private, liberal arts college. It also graduated the first woman doctor.

Slide 29: Sonnenberg Gardens and Mansion located in Canandaigua. 50-acre State Park with 9 gardens and a 40 room Queen Anne style mansion.

Slide 30: One of the gardens—Japanese. Tours begin in May.

Slide 31: Memorial Day Museum in downtown Waterloo which is federally recognized as the birthplace of Memorial Day. Exhibits tell the story and history of Memorial Day.

Slide 32: Waterloo Premium Outlets are on Rte. 318 between thruway Exits 41 and 42. Offering 100 stores for your shopping pleasure.

Slide 33: Del Lago Casino on Rt. 414 just off thruway Exit 41 offers gaming, entertainment, restaurants...

Slide 35: Muranda Cheese Company features 14 varieties of cheese. Located in Waterloo on Rt. 96.

Slide 48: George Bailey Bridge in Seneca Falls is thought to be the bridge in "*It's a Wonderful Life*" movie. There is a "It's a Wonderful Life" museum because Seneca Falls feels they were the inspiration for Frank Capras movie.
