#### The Verna Mulholland Friend of Education Award Nominations due by February 15, 2023

In 1983 *The Verna Mulholland Friend of Education Award* was established in honor of Verna Mulholland, elected *Pi* State President in 1981, and serving until her untimely death in 1982. The Award was in response to her interest in recognizing non-educators' influence on education.

A stipulation of the Award is to honor a New York State woman, ineligible for membership in the Delta Kappa Gamma Society International, who has been a positive influence on education. The recipient must be a woman outside the profession who has worked significantly toward improving the educational opportunities of others and who has given outstanding service to promote quality education.

Chapters are encouraged to nominate deserving women for this Award. The nomination application should be sent to the *Verna Mulholland Friend of Education Award* Chair by February 15, 2023. The nomination application form is on the State Website, <a href="www.dkgnystate.org">www.dkgnystate.org</a>. At this point it is not a fillable PDF. The form needs to be printed, filled out, necessary signatures obtained, mailed to the Chair and postmarked by February 15.

Question: What is the Pi State Educational Foundation?

Answer: The Pi Sate Educational Foundation is a tax-exempt organization that promotes literacy and learning by supporting projects developed by NYSO members and chapters. These projects are supported solely by memberships and donations.

Question: Why should I join the Educational Foundation?

Answer: You should join the Educational Foundation so that you can apply for a grant that enables you or your chapter to promote literacy. The directors met recently to review the last round of grant applications. Congratulations to Anna Marie Bonafide from Alpha Nu. Her chapter's project "Alpha Nu Domestic Shelter Literacy Program" was awarded \$700. Also, congratulations to Jen Lester from Alpha Tau who will be receiving \$500 for her project "Interactive Read Aloud Project". We look forward to hearing about these projects at our April meeting in Albany.

Question: What is the cost of membership?

Answer: A lifetime membership costs only \$25.

Question: What is a great gift for a new member of your chapter?

Answer: A lifetime membership in the Pi State Educational Foundation. Your new member will then be on her way to being able to apply for Educational Foundation project grants and/or the Literacy Scholarship.

Question: What can chapters or NYSO members do to help support the Educational Foundation?

Answer: When remembering someone special in your life or in your chapter consider making a donation to the Educational Foundation "In Memory of" or "In Honor of" that person. Another way to help support the Foundation is to have a benefit drawing during one of your meetings and donate the proceeds to the Foundation.

Question: What is the Literacy Scholarship and when is the application due?

Answer: The Pi State Educational Foundation Literacy Scholarship is intended to further the recipient's knowledge in the area of literacy and learning. This may be accomplished by attendance at college courses, workshops, conventions, seminars, trainings, and/or conferences. The applicant must be a member of the Foundation for at least one year and the application is due February 15, 2023.

Question: What should I do if I would like to become a director of the Educational Foundation?

Answer: The term for a director is four years. As of July 1 we will have one director position that will need to be filled. If you are a member of the Educational Foundation and are interested in becoming a director please send a letter of interest to Sue Summerfield, 346 Noeltner Road, Amsterdam, N.Y. 12010 or email the letter to <a href="mailto:summy1@frontier.com">summy1@frontier.com</a> by March 1, 2023. We will be voting on the new director at the NYSO DKG Convention in April.

Question: Where can I find membership and grant/scholarship applications and donation forms?

Answer: On the state website home page scroll down to the bottom and click on "Pi State Educational Foundation" or click on "New York State" and then click "Pi State Educational Foundation".

#### **Funding Chapter Projects: The Bea Small Award**

The *Bea Small Award* was established in 1999 in memory of **Bea Small**, a member of the *Omega* Chapter. The sole purpose of this Award is to recognize State Chapter(s) having an existing program/project which addresses a need of a specific population within the Chapter's geographical area.

The Board of Trustees administering this Award consists of four Trustees: Chair Mary-Martha Harvey (24-*Omega EC*) *Executive Committee Rep*; Joanne Carroll (40-*Alpha Pi* E) *Educational Excellence Committee Rep*; Marie Scoles (52-*Beta Delta* EC) *Communications & Marketing Committee Rep*; Evelyne Bottorf (24-*Omega* EC) *Omega Chapter Rep*.

The submitted project must have been originated by the Chapter and be ongoing for a minimum of two years. The project must respond to the needs of a particular population within the Chapter's geographical area.

The postmarked deadline for submitting the application form to the Chair of the Board of Trustees is February 15<sup>th</sup>. The application form may be found on the NYSO Website:

https://www.dkgnystate.org/applications-for-new-york-state-awards-scholarships--grants-in-aid.html. The application must be submitted by the Chapter President, a Chapter Officer or the Chapter Project Chair. The Chapter President must also sign the application.

Electronic submission of the application is preferred. If a project is funded, an article with a photograph should be written for an issue of *Pi Lights*, the NYSO website and the local media.

The Award consists of a certificate and a monetary amount to be determined by the Board of Trustees. The Award(s) shall be presented to the Chapter during a Spring Executive Board Meeting or NYSO Convention. There is a Post-Project Report Form that is to be submitted by March 15<sup>th</sup> of the following year. The Award will be publicized in the Fall, Winter or Spring issues of *Pi Lights* and on the NYSO Website.

#### **COMMUNICATIONS & MARKETING**



  - 5. Explore the use of other platforms, including Google, to improve communication
  - 6. Explore the use of hybrid meetings to stay connected with members
- 7. Encourage the use of electronic programs for professional research, feedback and planning such as Wiki, Survey Monkey and blogs.

#### Literacy Education Professor at the Warner School Receives Prestigious Educators Award

The Delta Kappa Gamma International Society (New York Chapter) presented its 2022 *Frederica Hollister Professional Educators Award* to Literacy Expert <u>Carol Anne St. George</u>, a professor in Teaching and Curriculum at the Warner School of Education and Human Development. In April, she was recognized for her contributions and commitment to education in New York State and nationally at an Awardsuncheon in Utica, New York.

St. George, who directs the <u>Literacy Teacher Education Program</u> at the Warner School, leads efforts to help children read and write better and ultimately improve their school success. Nearly a decade ago, she created <u>Project READ</u>, a long-standing, successful partnership program that continues to have a local and global impact today.

Established in 2011 with funding and support from the <u>William & Sheila Konar Foundation</u>, Project READ is a partnership program with Rochester's School 33 and East High School's upper and lower schools. It was designed with two goals: to support Rochester City School District students' literacy learning and help prepare exceptional literacy educators. St. George leads the community engagement initiative today that involves young learners, preservice and practicing teachers, literacy specialists and community members.

Project READ has helped strengthen the literacy learning and skills of hundreds of elementary school students through powerful reading, writing and speaking opportunities over the past decade. But they are not the only ones who learn and grow from this reciprocal community engagement program. For graduate students at the Warner School, Project READ connects instruction to real-life literacy and opportunities in the real world. Through Project READ, the team of educators and Warner interns provide direct-targeted tutoring services, in-class support and modeling of best practices for teachers, literacy professional development for teachers and family literacy activities.

St. George received a doctorate in teaching and curriculum from the Warner School in 2009. A veteran educator, she brings extensive experience as a teacher, ranging from preschool to graduate school. Her research examines how teachers can more effectively collaborate with families to support student literacy and learning. In addition to her academic role at Warner, she continues to lead an annual campaign in February that promotes the importance of reading aloud to children of all ages. The social media push has garnered support from individuals worldwide who participate by sharing and tagging photos of books they are reading aloud to children during the month-long campaign.

The Frederica Hollister Professional Educator's Award was established in 1988 from a bequest of Past NYSO President Frederica Hollister. Along with honoring the recipient of this Award, it also honors the memory of Frederica Hollister, whose contributions to education and women educators were exceptional. The <a href="Delta Kappa Gamma">Delta Kappa Gamma</a> International Society has more than 100,000 members, roughly 2,000 representing the local New York State Organization.

In addition to receiving the prestigious award, the Delta Kappa Gamma International Society presented St. George with a donation check. Project READ was selected as her charity of choice.
