President's Banquet, Saturday Evening, April 29, 2023

Past Pi State Presidents, Past International President, Executive Committee, Executive Board and members and my family, it is with humble excitement I accept the position of New York State Organization DKG President for the 2023-2025 Biennium. This is the first time in the history of NYSO DKG that you have elected a State President for a second term, and I want to *thank you* for putting your faith in my leadership. I consider this an honor, and do not take this responsibility lightly.

Our theme for the 2023 - 2025 Biennium will be **Moving Forward with** *Manageable Leadership*.

The demands placed on educators in the last decade have reduced the time available for women to initiate and sustain professional, collegial relationships that promote personal and professional growth. Recruiting and retaining quality educators in the workforce is at an all-time low, placing additional responsibilities on those who currently serve the educational community. Teachers entering the field of education have many talents to share, yet need a support system to affirm their efforts and achievements as they establish and maintain their careers.

DKG has so much to offer in support of current and rising educators, so many Benefits of Membership! Yet we need to embrace the opportunity to build our future. Understanding time is finite, we must endeavor to identify current educators who exemplify the qualities of Key Women Educators, women who will benefit from our organization and in turn will benefit us in sustaining our future.

- 1. We will continue to embrace the benefits of technology to afford accessibility to meetings and resources and enhance training opportunities to prepare our current and future leaders. Many of us have increased our skills with leading online meetings, and the extra ZOOM account at the state level will give increased access to this resource.
- 2. We will continue to identify members with leadership talents and refine our leadership programs to include a formalized mentoring component, pairing a past or current leader with new State Committee Chairs and Officers. It is hoped that adding this piece to our Leadership plan will support the ideal of *Manageable Leadership* as well as retain the connection of members leaving leadership positions. Executive Committee Officers and Elected Personnel will reflect on their current responsibilities and suggest revisions that show a plan to make their job manageable. Officer responsibilities may be adjusted to show a balance of positions.
- 3. I will be asking the Executive Committee to consider making funds available to Area Councils who would like to host multi-chapter events to recruit new members, with a focus on identifying current educators. Presentation resources available through International will be shared. Area Councils will be encouraged to engage potential candidates in dialog that affirms their dedication and achievements as educators as well as benefits of being a DKG member.

Thank you for recognizing my leadership potential and offering this opportunity to serve as your NYSO President for the 2023-2025 biennium.

Important BYLAW and Standing Rule Information for Chapters

Your State BYLAWS and Standing Rules Committee presented 18 proposed changes to our documents at the April 28-30 Convention. Some of these were due to the International Constitutional Convention during the summer of 2022. Our documents must be in compliance with all International documents. Other changes were proposed by Sate Committees. You can see the complete list in the Winter 2023 issue of *Pi Lights*.

International changed the description of some membership levels. If your Standing Rules describe membership levels, then you need to consider the new wording in Article III, Section C. International did away with Induction fees. So, if your Rules mention an Induction fee, then make the change. The process that International uses to collect dues changed and the wording in Article IV Finances, Section A.3 reflects the new process. International collects a one-time fee of \$49.50 for Chapter Honorary members. Chapters can charge Honorary members dues.

At the International and State levels the Nominations Committee name changed to Nominating Committee. Chapters can also make this change if so desired.

Make all necessary changes so that the name of our organization is NYSO DKG.

Chapters need to submit their Standing Rules for review each biennium. Chapters can find the check off sheet for required and recommended items on the State website. You can email rules to <u>suekenoyerdkg@gmail.com</u> or mail them to 254 Allen RD, Plattsburgh, NY 12901. As you work through the process, please feel free to send us questions.

On a final note, your State BYLAWS Committee will be submitting the state documents to International for review once all the changes approved by the Executive Board and General Session are made.

"The Future Is Now"

The DKG North Central Conference Delta Lake Bible Conference Center Rome, New York October 28th, 2023

This year's Conference focuses on the theme "*The Future Is Now*" and will showcase educational innovations that are happening within the Mohawk Valley Region.

Key presenters at the Conference are several Delta Kappa Gamma *Nu* Chapter members: **Erica Schoff**, **Michelle Hall** and **Christina Warner**. These DKG educators are helping to bring 21st century changes that are empowering local students to prepare for life after high school.

Schoff and Hall will be presenting on the continuum of services and pathways provided by School to Career Programs, Pathways in Technology Early College High School (P-TECH), and the Utica City School District. The unique program provides cutting edge graduation pathways and also empowers students to have 21st century power skills that they will be able to utilize as they enter the workforce. In addition, Warner will share details about the P-TECH program which is offered at the Oneida-Herkimer Madison BOCES. The program is currently in its eighth year of operation and offers an integrated high school curriculum focused on STEAM principles. The program enrolls freshmen students in a flexible and individualized four, five or six-year program combining academic rigor and career focus with graduates earning a high school diploma and an accredited Associate's degree from Mohawk Community College at no cost. Students experience internships with P-TECH business and industry partners. Graduates are regarded as viable candidates for employment with partnering companies.

Lastly, **Dr. Michael A. Carpenter**, Interim Dean, College of Engineering, SUNY Polytechnic Institute will be highlighting the growth in holistic approaches being planned and undertaken to increase the number of STEAM students trained for modern industry. SUNY Poly is currently working with community and industry partners. Dr. Carpenter will offer insights about special programs offered at the middle school as well as the high school levels for local students. As New York's only Premier Public Polytechnic he will share unique educational opportunities which are only matched by 5-6 academic institutions in the nation.

THE PI STATE ACHIEVEMENT COMMITTEE SELECTS TWO RECIPIENTS OF THE 2023 PI STATE ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

In presenting the Awards, **Dr. Andréa H. Morris**, Chair of the Pi State Achievement Award Committee 2021-23, gave a brief historical summary about the establishment of the Pi State Achievement Award. During the 2020 pandemic, Past State President, **Deborah Bedard** (2015-2017) was acknowledged as the 2020 recipient. Previous awardees of the Pi State Achievement Award that were in attendance were recognized. This award is given for the third time at a State Convention to two recipients, previously awarded in the 1990 and 2003.



Beryl Szwed, the first recipient of the 2023 Pi State Achievement Award, has been a member of the DKG/NYSO, *Beta Mu* (N) Chapter for 30 years. She has served on the Chapter level as Chair of various Committees, Vice-President, Treasurer and Chapter President.

She has attended State, Regional and International Conferences and Conventions; served on the Audit Committee and was the Executive Secretary (2003-2011) and was the Representative for the Northern Finance Council on the International level.

The second recipient **Susan T. Kenoyer** is Past State President (2019-2021) and has been a member of NYSO DKG, *Psi* Chapter (N) for 28 years. She has had and continues to add to her extensive active service and involvement on the Chapter Level, serving as Chapter President and Secretary for 7 years, Chairs of various Chapter Committees, Chair of Northern Area Council Meetings for two years, and has attended 10 Area Council Meetings. She was Registrar at NYSO DKG State Conferences and Conventions, and Liaison for North Central, Capital and Northern Areas. Susan has also attended 9 Regional and 5 International Meetings.

Sue has held mathematical positions in Michigan, Florida, Kansas and Plattsburg as a teaching assistant, assistant precalculus coordinator and adjunct instructor. From 2014-present, Sue has been a member of the Mathematics Department and the Champlain Valley Council of Retirees (CVCR). In the Northern Adirondack Area, she served as Mathematic Department Chair for 26 years.

2023 Ruth Williams DKG Scholarship

The 2023 Ruth Williams NYSO DKG Scholarship was awarded to **Christine Bennett**, *Omega* Chapter EC, at the 2023 Convention.

School district leadership requires a varied professional '*toolbox*' of knowledge, strategies and grit. While NYSED School Building Leader (SBL) and School District Leader (SDL) Certification college programs provide a broad understanding of pedagogy, curriculum supervision, strategic planning and building leadership guidance, the intricacies of leading within a specific department such as Human Resources are not always prevalent. Human Resources leadership is a common BA/BS degree earned within the private

sector. Likewise, a common Human Resources Certification earned by those with BA/BS in a Human Resources field is PHR.

The PHR, Professional in Human Resources Certification, is offered through Human Resources Certification Institute (HRCI). Those in HR college programs complete their degree and use that knowledge to take the PHR exam. Since Christine Bennett comes from a 15-year teaching background, Christine will apply DKG scholarship funds to complete a Cornell University PHR Exam Preparation Course and then take the PHR certification exam. A thorough knowledge of HR competencies (such as: ethical hiring, diversity and inclusion, US law and Federal regulations and workforce management) can all advance student learning initiatives and school district performance. Such focuses keep the school district in compliance while ultimately providing the background functions required to meet our mission and vision for student success.

Christine Bennett is currently the Executive Director of Human Resources with Newark Central School District, Newark, NY.



Beta Celebrates 85th Birthday

On April 22, 2023 *Beta* Chapter celebrated their 85th birthday. The Chapter was formed on February 12, 1938 by 12 women educators of which three were NYSO State Founders: Honorary Member **Dr. R.** Louise Finch, Dean of Woman Cornell University, Pauline Meyer Head of the Music Department at Cortland Normal School and **Dr.** Alice Pierce Director of Rural Education at Cortland Normal School. Another Chapter founder **Dr. Elsa Brookfield**, teacher of French and German at Southside High School in Elmira later became NYSO Second State President (1938-1942).

The Chapter went from Lake Ontario, the Greater Syracuse area to Elmira and Binghamton and covered most of central New York. *Beta* members were heavily involved in the State and International activities. *Xi, Nu, Pi, Sigma, Mu* and *Rho* were all formed by *Beta* Members. Chapters that were later formed from *Beta* included *Alpha Rho, Beta Rho, Beta Sigma, Beta Kappa, Beta Upsilon*, and *Alpha Omega*.

Beta President **Gladys Mersereau** (1943-45) became the fifth State President (1946-48.) She later became the First State Executive Secretary and the first recipient of the Pi State Achievement Award in 1954. In all, five *Beta* members have received the Pi State Achievement

Award. Besides Gladys, **Dr. Alice Pierce** (1955), **Dr. Elsa Brookfield** (1957), **Carol Kendall** (1969), and **Marie Cady** (1971).

Special Guest NYSO Secretary **Amy Zimmerman**, *Alpha Tau* discussed *Beta*'s contribution and involvement in the Society and encouraged members to seek new members. Also in attendance was NYSO Parliamentarian **Karen Crumley**, *Tau* who encouraged members to get involved at the State level. After a presentation on the Chapter's history by NYSO First Vice President and *Beta* member **Barbara Bostwick-Quinn**, the Chapter participated in a pound auction to benefit their new Grants-In-Aid project.
